






Our Need for Good Friday

"Definitions and Guidelines for Discipline," the document that establishes our church body's necessary guidelines for our conduct, actions, and ways in which we communicate with one another, was recently revised to include members of congregations, in addition to rostered ministers and congregations. You can read the document here: https://bit.ly/38CqFOy

The grounds for discipline of members of congregations seem obvious. They include persistent and public denial of the Christian faith; willful and/or criminal conduct grossly unbecoming of a member of the church; continual and intentional interference with the ministry of the congregation; and willful and repeated harassment, abuse, bullying, libel, or slander of another member(s) of the congregation, including rostered ministers (pastors and deacons) and staff.

It is a fact of human life, including life in the church, that we do not make rules until rules are needed. In other words, this document was expanded to include members of congregations because the kinds of behavior that are grounds for discipline are occurring in our church. Though the church is certainly a gathering of sinners, it is not a place where we sin free of accountability and consequence.

I share this for two reasons. First, we are currently experiencing a great deal of conflict in the congregations of our synod. We all need a reminder of the promise we make when a pastor or deacon is installed: "In all things, to strive to live together in the peace and harmony of Christ." We all need to pause and recognize that there is hurt, brokenness, accountability, and consequences when we do not.

Second, we receive this newsletter on Good Friday. We all need to contemplate how much even Christ's Church needs Jesus to save us and to raise us to new life. Whether we are emerging from the pandemic new or still waiting for that time to come, we will emerge having said and done things contrary to living together in the peace and harmony of Christ. Perhaps we can bring them to the cross this Good Friday, not to absolve ourselves and to move on, but so that we can confess our sins, seek forgiveness appropriately, amend our lives, and move on to new life together.

I am finding the Prayer of the Day for Ash Wednesday especially meaningful as I prepare to worship and preach on Good Friday:

Almighty and ever-living God, you hate nothing you have made, and you forgive the sins of all who are penitent. Create in us new and honest hearts, so that, truly repenting of our sins, we may receive from you, the God of all mercy, full pardon and forgiveness through your Son, Jesus Christ, our Savior, and Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever,

I am also praying that, in our interactions, the church has the faith and courage to authentically and genuinely be Easter for itself and for the world,
