Pastor's Notes

June 2022

Sesquicentennial – that the name for a 150th anniversary celebration. Lebanon Lutheran was established in the Pentecost season, June, 1872. The original part of the current church building was constructed five years later. It became a member of the Swedish Evangelical Lutheran Augustana Synod. Its first synod President was Tuve Hasselquist, and upon his death in 1891, congregations ere given large engravings of his portrait. Much to my surprise Lebanon still has that engraving. We have repaired and framed it, and it hangs in our narthex (fancy word for lobby).

This year – 2022 – we are a different congregation. The Swedish influence remains, but very few members keep an active Swedish identity. Sixty years ago the Swedish network of congregations joined the Lutheran Church in America (the LCA, formed in convention in Detroit in 1962) and cast its future with its American identity. In 1987 more Lutheran groups felt the urge to merge, and so 35 years ago formed the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (the ELCA, formed in Columbus, Ohio in 1987).

The way I describe the Swedish legacy on Lebanon in 2022 (besides its great smorgasbord) is:

- 1. Its priority to Global concerns
- 2. Its outward looking focus on serving its community
- 3. Its love of worship, music, liturgy, Bible and song
- 4. Its attentiveness to the wider church, Lutheran and otherwise
- 5. Its ability to be church, with reconciling skills despite disagreements, and hard issues,
- 6. Its support of Pastors, even when the Pastor was being difficult (it happens)

On Sunday June 5, Pentecost Sunday 2022 we celebrate, not the past, but we celebrate the future into which the past has brought us. We welcome Craig A Satterlee as our worship leader, Bishop of the North/West Lower Michigan Synod, and will follow worship with a dinner, which weather permitting will be seated outside. Whitehall will hold its "Feet On The Street" beginning at 2 pm, a great time to greet people and to walk off the dinner. We have adopted the Marty Haugen song, "All Are Welcome" as our sesquicentennial theme song, whose lyrics you can read on the next page. Word of warning though, being welcoming is not the same as finding the lost, inviting in the neighbor, and seeking out our place in the world.


This is the new version of the GivePlus app, and must be downloaded again from your App Store.


