Cold December flies away at the rose-red splendor. April's crowning glory breaks While the whole world wonders.

The resurrection is not dependent on the weather, however, Resurrection is God's act that guarantees God's desires for us and all creation live. We pray that when those desires unfold, they happen through us (some will recognize Luther's Small Catechism here).

We have said goodbye to some good friends this season, and commended them to God's eternal care. We have considered how to live hopeful lives (some will recognize Lara's book title here).

We have seen large scale acts of violence (I am thinking of Ukraine and the horrible acts of gun violence at Michigan State and so many other places).

I don't expect any one or two new laws will eliminate gun violence - - but enough acts and enough willpower and perhaps we will see the culture change that has come to rely on guns to solve problems. There are better ways.

I don't expect any one or two laws about gay, lesbian or trans people will change hearts. But perhaps they and some will power on our part will make life safer and more honest. Resistance is strong in election years (and when is it not an election year?). We are people of grace and resurrection - not condemnation nor rejection.

Some of our adults are facing some serious issues soon, and some of our young people have some life decisions to make. By encouragement and patience God's desires, whatever they turn out to be, will unfold. We are not all of one mind always of course - -

We've all had different experiences and expectations. But we will not stop supporting one another, praying for one another, encouraging one another and discouraging violence and rejection. Our 'words and deeds will be pure and honorable' (Luther again).

And it will be Easter.

Many of us have delighted in Dr. Wally Taylor's journey through the Corinthian correspondence this January and February. Paul has some of the greatest greetings in his letters. He is always thankful for partnership in the Gospel and the work of the Spirit that is happening. Even when he is about to scold one of the churches in his letters, still he thanks God for them, their work and their generosity.

I Corinthians 1:4-6 "I give thanks to my God always for you because of the grace of God that has been given to you in Christ Jesus, for every way you have been enriches in him, in speech and knowledge of every kind...".

In the style of Paul, we as a synod, God's people together, give thanks for the grace of God within you. As we have closed the books on the year 2022 and entered 2023, with all its ups and downs, we give thanks for your partnership and generosity. As we hear of other synods with deep deficits, our synod council and its leaders have managed funds well.

It was a year of unknowns. Many congregations received Covid Funds in some way or another in 2020 and 2021, none of which were available in 2022. Congregations are back to worshiping in person but very few have attendance anywhere near what numbers were like a few years ago. The world has changed, the church is changing, but the Word of God stands fast. Through it all you, the congregations of the North/West Lower Michigan Synod, have remained faithful and generous. Some are still struggling, while others were able to step up and give generously. We are the people of God together.

Through your generosity we have been able to make Lutheran Disaster Response gifts, we have supported new outreach ideas, we have cared for congregations in the call process, supported the all encompassing work of the ELCA, and assisted congregations in holy closure.

Paul also wrote to the Corinthians: Il Corinthians 9: 6 " The point is this: the one who sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and the one who sows bountifully will also reap bountifully. ...God loves a cheerful giver."
