Thrivent Update SECURE 2.0 Aims to Brighten the Future for Retirement Savers

The \$1.7 trillion appropriations bill passed by Congress at the end of last year included some notable provisions affecting workplace retirement plans and IRAs. Dubbed the **SECURE 2.0 Act of 2022**, the new legislation builds on the sweeping Setting Every Community Up for Retirement Enhancement Act that was passed in 2019.

The following is a brief summary of some of the most notable initiatives.

- Later age for RMDs, SECURE 2.0 raises the age from 72 to 73 beginning in 2023 and to 75 in 2033.

- No RMDs from Roth 401(k) accounts.
- Higher limits and looser restrictions on qualified charitable distributions from IRAs.
- Higher catch-up contributions.
- Roth matching contributions.
- Automatic enrollment and automatic saving increases.
- · Emergency savings accounts.
- Matching contributions for qualified student loan repayments.
- 529 rollovers to Roth IRAs.
- New exceptions to the 10% early-withdrawal penalty.
- Saver's match.
- More part-time employees can participate in retirement plans.
- Rules for lifetime income products in retirement plans.
- Retirement savings lost and found.
- Military spouses.
