**Regarding the Liturgy**, the Congregation's responses are marked with a **Q**. **P** is for Pastor.








#### **Prelude** — Choir Processional

This cup is the new covenant in my blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin.


Do this for my remembrance.


