On Sunday morning February 11, it will be two days shy of one year since the horrifying shooting at Michigan State University.

It would be a second tragedy if we as a nation did not continue efforts to reduce gun violence in the US, now. The leading cause of death for young people in America. And to reduce our reliance on guns to solve our problems. It is nation-wide, urban and rural and small town, rich neighborhood and poor, affecting young and old alike with trauma that lasts. To add to the urgency, the trial over the Oxford school shooting is happening right now.

To bring the lament and the hope into our worship we have had an orange candle by the place where we read the Word of God, and we will remember the events and the people in our worship on Sunday February 11 at 10:15 am. You will be welcome to share your stories, your remembrances, your prayers on that day.

The Epiphany season comes to an end that Sunday. Ash Wednesday and Valentine's Day are both February 14. We will start Wednesday potlucks and Evening prayer that night. I can see us commemorating both by reading First Corinthians 13 – "If I speak in the tongues of angels but have not love . . . I gain nothing." Legends about St Valentine abounded in the Middle Ages, especially stories of restoring sight to a young girl named Julia, to whom he wrote a letter she was now able to read; he signed it "Your Valentine." And so we have been collecting eyeglasses which we will deliver to the lions Club through one of our area eye doctors who collect them for the club. Epiphany season is a time for sight, insight, and new directions, as the Magi experienced when the encountered Jesus Christ and also uncovered Herod's true character, and went back to their own country, differently, following a different path.

And finally we will keep Lent with Wednesday potlucks and evening prayer, Lenten noontime lunches at area churches, collect personal care items for refugees and foster care children, kits we will assemble the Sunday after Easter, April 7. The schedule for all of these things is in this newsletter, is in the Friday emails, in the bulletin insert yellow pages, and on the announcement slides at worship.

This is what we do – welcome to Lebanon.





Sab-bat-i-cal: A Rest or Break from Work

"Moreover I gave them my Sabbaths, as a sign between me and them, so that they might know that I the Lord sanctify them" (Ezekiel 20:12)

This message comes to you as Bishop Satterlee is enjoying the first month of a well-deserved 3-month sabbatical planned with the full encouragement and support of Synod Council in accordance with the synod's sabbatical guidelines for all rostered ministers. A link to the 2024 Compensation Guidelines is provided on the synod website for reference (see Appendix C for the sabbatical guidelines).

What is a sabbatical? A sabbatical (from the Hebrew šabat or sabbath; Latin sabbaticus; and Greek sabbatikos) is an extended period of time intentionally spent on things like study, travel, rest, renewal, personal development, reinforcement and rejuvenation of relationships with God and others – activities outside of the routine job that take place without the demands and stress of daily responsibilities.

Why are sabbaticals a blessing for our rostered ministers? Many parishioners believe the call of a rostered minister is relatively stress-free, with the primary focus centered on weekend worship and related activities. In reality, pastors and deacons across our synod work tirelessly throughout each week to meet the strategio needs of their congregation(s) – including worship leadership, education and Bible studies, service projects, community support and the like. In addition, we rely on our pastors to serve as our "shepherds" during congregational conflict, during our more personal events such as baptisms, weddings, funerals, and as they provide 24/7 pastoral care and counseling in times of need. At the synod level, the bishop also serves as "shepherd" to rostered ministers (pastors and deacons) across the synod. Since the pandemic, there has been an enhanced need to help these leaders manage conflict within their congregations along with the feelings of sadness, hurt, anger and frustration that have resulted within their ministries. Our rostered ministers are honored to serve in their calls and they are committed to the important work they lead. Each do their best to manage the inherent stress that builds up as they deal with the mentally challenging and emotionally exhausting deep, "inner soul" issues we put before them week after week, month after month, and year after year. A periodic sabbatical provides a blessed opportunity for our rostered ministers to step away and renew, refresh and recharge for the work to come.

How frequently are sabbaticals recommended? It is up to the Congregation Council (or equivalent leadership body) to set the schedule for sabbatical leaves for their rostered ministers to meet the needs of the organization. According to our synod's Compensation Guidelines, a sabbatical of up to three months in duration is encouraged for full-time rostered ministers who have been in their present call five years or more, with continued eligibility for additional sabbaticals within the same call every five years after that. From a financial standpoint, salary, housing and other benefits are expected to continue throughout the sabbatical period with the congregation taking full responsibility for alternative staffing to cover needs during the absence.

With all of this in mind, I encourage you to think about the stressors being managed, both outwardly and inwardly, by your pastor(s) and/or deacon(s). Are there ways you can provide additional support within their ongoing ministry to help alleviate known stressors? Is your congregation supportive of sabbaticals for rostered ministers and is a schedule in place for long-range planning? Your encouragement and support of and advocacy for this meaningful break from ministry will mean the world to your rostered minister and to your congregation in the long run!
