

The White Lake Giving Tree Arrives



The White Lake Giving Tree season is beginning. This community-wide outreach program provides food and gifts to families in need at Christmas that live in the Montague and Whitehall school districts. Over 315 families received assistance last year. Each family receives perishable and nonperishable food boxes, as well as each child (newborn to 18) receives a clothing gift and a toy or personal gift. Lebanon has a tree in the vestibule with gift and clothing tags for people to take and fill the need, then return the gift and tag by November 23rd. Please help if you are able.

Letter from the Bishop

Dear Siblings in N/WL Michigan,

My daughter sometimes teases me about having dark thoughts and she's not wrong! Among those thoughts is this — that I have thought multiple times as I am up front on Sunday leading worship, including this past Sunday: "What would I do if someone came in the back of the worship space with a gun in hand?" I suspect that there are other pastoral leaders who have wondered the same thing.

Shortly after I had that thought this past Sunday, we finished worship, I fished my phone out of my pocket and then swiped right to see what was in my news feed. There I found a thumbnail photo of a church building on fire and the headline: DEVELOPING: Church Shooting and Fire in Grand Blanc, Michigan. Those are our neighbors. When things happen to our neighbors, it becomes clear thit could also happen to us.

These are such dark thoughts as I write my first newsletter article as your bishop, but my call is to lead and so I feel compelled to speak to what is on our hearts and minds today. What shall we say about these things? What shall we do about these things? Here' the best that I have to offer in this moment:

- <u>Pray:</u> Not in a "thoughts and prayers" kind of way, but please name this community Grand Blanc Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints in God's hearing. Lift them up to the Light of Christ. These are siblings in faith who themselves value the power of prayer and to hold them in our prayers is a way to support them meaningfully.
- <u>Plan:</u> Ask the questions together as a congregation, "What would we do if someone arrived with the intent to cause harm?" Are there people monitoring doors during worship, especially those that are secondary and unlocked? Do you have the church address posted near phones in case someone needs to call for help? Do you walk out in pairs at night after meetings or worship? A free safety checklist encompassing a broad view of safety issues is available at the link below. LOOK HERE Work with your local fire and police departments so that they know they layout of your building and to received advice that they have.
- <u>Act:</u> Work for expansive mental health availability in your community. Listen to the people in your circle who are struggling with deep feelings of anger or hopelessness. Donate to an organization that passes out free fun locks. Contact your local congressional representative to discuss the need for improved mental health programs and funding for veteran mental health services. Advocate for mental health services to be offered in your school district. Examine your own use of language and social media and find ways to turn down the heat of the conversations you are having with others.
